Course description: An introduction to the history of Europe from the Enlightenment to the present. Course activities provide opportunities to learn some history, to learn how to learn more about history, to think critically about history, and to develop the learning skills of reading, writing, speaking, and listening.

Required books:

Text: Marvin Perry, *Western Civilization*, Vol. II

Readings: Rousseau, *The Social Contract*
Dumas, *The Three Musketeers*
Mill, *On Liberty*

Course requirements: A mid-term exam and a final exam on lectures and text assignments, writing assignments and discussion related to the readings, class participation, and map tests.

Final grade computation: Mid-term exam, 30 percent; final exam, 30 percent; readings, 20 percent; and class participation, 20 percent. Map tests will raise or lower the final course grade.

Mid-term and final exam: Will consist of essay questions and identification of terms.

Attendance: Final grade will be lowered by one point for each unexcused absence, late arrival, and early departure. Excuses must include documentation from the Dean.

Makeup tests: Will be more difficult than scheduled tests.

Late Assignments: Will suffer a grade penalty of ten points for each class day late. No excuses.

Student participation: Student questions and participation in class discussions are strongly encouraged and will have a positive effect on grades. No eating, drinking, smoking, chewing, yexing, and so forth, in class.
