Course description: History 104 is an examination of world history from the beginning of the modern age to the present. Course activities provide opportunities to learn some history, to learn how to learn more about history, to think critically about history, and to develop the learning skills of reading, writing, speaking, and listening.

Required books:

Text: Duiker & Spielvogel, *The Essential World History*, Vol. II

Readings: Rousseau, *The Social Contract*
Mill, *On Liberty*
The Life of Olaudah Equiano

Course requirements: A mid-term exam and final exam on lectures and text assignments, a writing assignment, discussion related to the readings, class participation, and map tests.

Final grade computation: Mid-term exam, 30 percent; the final exam, 30 percent; the writing assignment, 20 percent; class participation, 20 percent. The map tests will raise or lower the final grade.

Mid-term exam and final exam: These will consist of essay questions and terms for identification.

Attendance: The final course grade will be lowered by one point for each unexcused absence, late arrival, and early departure. Excuses must include documentation from the Dean.

Makeup exam: Will be more difficult than the regular exam.

Late assignments: These will suffer a ten-point penalty for each class day late. No excuses.

Student participation: Student questions and participation in class discussions are encouraged and will have a positive effect on grades. No eating, drinking, smoking, chewing, yexing, and so forth, in class.
