



## College of Charleston 2008 Summer Study Abroad Program

### Courses Offered:

**CLAS 121: Classical Greece:** an introduction to the art, architecture, history and society of classical Greece (3)

**CLAS 122: Bronze Age Greece:** an introduction to the art, architecture, history and society of Minoan and Mycenaean Greece (3)

These courses apply to the majors and minors in Classics and to the general education requirement in Humanities at the College of Charleston. Students meet for three two-hour orientation sessions during the spring 2008 semester. The program includes visits to the principal archaeological sites in Athens and its environs, the Peloponnesus, central Greece, Crete and Santorini. In addition to the well known archaeological sites of Athens, the itinerary includes visits to Egina, Corinth, Nemea, Argos, Epidauros, Lerna, Tiryns, Mycenae, Dendri, Pylos, Bassae, Olympia, Delphi, Orchomenos, Thebes, Knossos, Phaestos, Ayia Triada, Lassithi, Mallia, Kato Zakro, Acrotiri, and ancient Thera. Students must be able to walk and climb along moderately difficult unpaved paths for long periods of time.

Dr. J. Frank Morris received his Ph.D. in Classics from the University of Cincinnati and is currently Associate Professor of Classics at the College of Charleston. He has conducted similar programs in Greece on several occasions.

\*Cost includes a non-refundable application fee of \$50 (for CofC students), roundtrip airfare **from Atlanta**, lodging, breakfasts, transportation, entrances into museums, international student ID card, and international health insurance. **TUITION IS NOT INCLUDED.** Tuition must be paid to the Treasurer's Office prior to departure.

Application and a \$550 deposit are due **February 1, 2008**. Scholarships of up to \$1000 each are available to CofC students for study abroad. Eligibility is based on demonstrated financial need and academic merit.
