

ASSISTANT PROFESSOR IN SCULPTURE

The Department of Studio Art at the College of Charleston seeks an artist with a strong commitment to creative work, teaching and service in a liberal arts environment. The position requires skills in all the traditional sculptural techniques including: mold making, casting, metal fabrication and woodworking. Also essential is a demonstrated competency in non-traditional approaches such as: installation, performance and time-based media. Mac based computer literacy required. The candidate must have a fluent understanding of contemporary issues and support a broad range of ideas and practices.

The successful applicant will teach three courses in sculpture per semester at all levels. Additional responsibilities include: advising, supervising independent study students, organizing and expanding the sculpture image collection, advising an active student art association and participation in some departmental and School of the Arts committees.

Candidates must have and MFA, a significant professional exhibition record in Sculpture and at least 3 years college level teaching experience beyond "teaching assistant." This is a tenure-track position. AA, WMA, EOE.
