- * **MATH 104 OR A HIGHER LEVEL STATISTICS COURSE IS HIGHLY RECOMMENDED TO FULFILL 3 CREDITS OF THE MATH REQUIREMENT. IT IS ALSO RECOMMENDED THAT THIS COURSE BE COMPLETED AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE AND AT LEAST WITHIN THE FIRST TWO SEMESTERS AFTER DECLARATION OF THE MAJOR.**
- * **SUGGESTED AREAS OF CONCENTRATION ARE ARCHAEOLOGY AND BIOLOGICAL ANTHROPOLOGY.**
