- * **ENGL 201, 202, & 207 ARE PREREQUISITES FOR ALL ENGLISH COURSES AT OR ABOVE THE 300 LEVEL.**
- * **A MINIMUM OF 15 HOURS OF ENGL COURSES AT THE 200 LEVEL OR HIGHER MUST BE TAKEN IN RESIDENCE.**
- * **IF ENGL 335 OR 338 IS USED TO FULFILL THE POST-1700 BRITISH LITERATURE REQUIREMENT, IT MAY NOT BE USED TO FULFILL THE POST-1900 AMERICAN REQUIREMENT AND VICE VERSA.**

² ENGL 101 & 102 or HONS 105 & 106 are prerequisites for all English courses at or above the 200 level.
³ Literature courses may count towards 6 credits of the General Education Humanities requirement.
