- * **ALL MAJORS MUST HAVE TAKEN AT LEAST TWO RELATED HISTORY COURSES (One 200 level & One 300 level) BEFORE SEEKING PERMISSION TO TAKE RESEARCH SEMINAR, SENIOR PAPER, OR BACHELOR'S ESSAY.**
