- * MATH REQUIREMENTS SHOULD BE SELECTED FROM: MATH 104 OR 250 (but not both), MATH 111, AND MATH 105 OR 120 (but not both). CERTAIN UPPER-LEVEL HONORS & MATHEMATICS COURSES WILL ALSO FULFILL THE PSYC MATH REQUIREMENT. (Please check with the Psychology Department Chair)
- * IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT STUDENTS TAKE ONE OR MORE OF THE REQUIRED MATH COURSES PRIOR TO ENROLLMENT IN PSYC 211.
- * ALL MAJORS ARE ADVISED TO TAKE PSYC 211, PSYC 220, AND A LAB AT THE EARLIEST OPPORTUNITY.
- * THE RESEARCH METHODS COURSE SHOULD BE CLOSELY FOLLOWED BY THE CORRESPONDING LAB COURSE.
- * SIX HOURS OF PSYCHOLOGY COURSES MAY BE USED TO FULFILL THE SOCIAL SCIENCE REQUIREMENT.
- * STRONG STUDENTS SHOULD CONSIDER AN INDEPENDENT STUDY PROJECT DURING THEIR JUNIOR OR SENIOR YEAR. (Consult your major advisor for details).
- * NO MORE THAN 6 HOURS OF PSYCHOLOGY 410 (Special Topics in Psychology) MAY COUNT TOWARDS THE MAJOR.
