- * **STUDENTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO INCLUDE COURSES IN ANTH, HIST, PSYC, POLS, PHIL, ECON, COMM, CSCI, AND INTERNATIONAL STUDIES. (See an Advisor)**
- * **COURSES REQUIRED IN THE CONCENTRATION AREAS MAY BE TAKEN IN ANY ORDER.**
- * **SOCY 102 & SOCY 103 WILL NOT COUNT TOWARDS THE SOCIOLOGY MAJOR OR MINOR.**
- * **MATH 104 OR A HIGHER LEVEL STATISTICS COURSE IS REQUIRED TO FULFILL THREE CREDITS OF THE MATH REQUIREMENT AND SHOULD BE TAKEN PRIOR TO SOCIOLOGY RESEARCH COURSES.**
- * **SOCY 202, 260, AND 271 MUST BE TAKEN WITHIN THE FIRST 18 HOURS OF THE MAJOR AND PRIOR TO SOCY 360 AND 371.**
- * **SOCY 271 & SOCY 371 ARE LINKED COURSES AND SHOULD BE TAKEN IN CONSECUTIVE SEMESTERS, WITH THE SAME INSTRUCTOR, WHENEVER POSSIBLE.**
- * **SOCIOLOGY MAJORS MAY WISH TO PURSUE A MINOR IN AFRICAN AMERICAN STUDIES, CRIMINAL JUSTICE, OR WOMEN'S STUDIES.**
